

Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF. One groom per athlete.

In principle this CSI is an AJA-EVENT of invitation. All AJA- members are invitated to participate. Furthermore, the organizer can invite possible candidates for AJA membership and a limited number of guest riders. Conditions are that these riders fulfill the age requirements and that during the current year they do not jump in classes whose initial course is higher than 1,30m.

Not admitted at AJA events are riders who were AJA members but were excluded by the General Assembly for any reasons.

At qualifying and Final competitions of the Challenge Cup, only AJA members can participate who are registered for this Cup.

At qualifying and Final competitions of the Europa and Challenge Cups, only AJA members receive points who are registered for the Cups and who have paid their AJA membership for the current year.

"NB: Withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show."

A horse that only starts once in the show still needs to pay the entire entry fee -No exceptions will be made.

V. FACILITIES OFFERED (Art. 132, 133)

1. ATHLETES

2. GROOMS

Hotels and meals at their own expense.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water will be provided by the Organising Committee.

OCs must provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms. These must be regularly maintained in a proper state of cleanliness.

3. HORSES

Transport expenses to be paid by the <u>athlete</u>. **The bedding of all stables will be shavings.** There is no straw available. The first bedding of <u>shavings</u> is provided free of charge. Additional bedding (shavings or hay) can be bought within the stable area at current prices and during certain hours.

The stables will be ready from Wednesday, 25th August 2010.

4. WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to assist them on arrival. <u>All horses are to be on the showgrounds before 17.00 h on Thursday.</u> If electricity is required, please confirm beforehand on the entry sheet

No transport from and to hotels is foreseen by the OC.

6. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES (Art. 136.1-2)

The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by athletes before entering the arena. Athletes not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted to enter the arena during the competition

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 167-171)

All complaints and objections to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. STARTING ORDER AND TIME TABLE

Entries for the classes have to be done each day before 18.00h, at the show secretary on official forms for the next day. The entries for the first day are to be made Thursday, August 26th 2010, before 18.00 h.

The starting order for the competitions will be as follows:

- I) First competition Draw
- 1) Second and following competitions on rotation
- I) Grand Prix special draw
- I) Team Competition special draw

Athletes wishing to school in speed competitions, must inform the OC before these competitions take place. These athletes start first.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The athletes must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition. Bridle according to 260. On order of the Org. Com. the riders must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. The first 8 riders of the class must present themselves in the prize giving ceremony or according AJA rules.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Only prizes in kind.

5. INSURANCES

The OC and its commissioners are not responsible for damages done to property, persons and fortune, caused by accidents and malady of athletes, horses and stable staff. Damages on coaches, harnesses, saddlery, stable utensils and all other objects (including damages of theft, fire) or other incidents are not under responsibility of the OC and its commissioners.

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horse. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances together with the approval of the Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes will be notified to all competitors and Officials as soon as possible and they will be reported to the Sec. Gen. by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133, 1005)

Individual athletes with one companion and one groom. In addition, horse owners get their passes according to the FEI-General Reg. Two owners max. per horse will be recognised. These show passes allow access all over the showgrounds. Public entrance is free. However they can only enter the public area's, not stabling area's nor the practice area.

8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Training areas with practice obstacles are on the show grounds at the competitors disposal. No riding is allowed outside these dimensions of training areas. Schooling hours on the paddocks or main ring are allowed in the time between 1 hour before the first class and half an hour after the last class. The training schedule will be published at the sect. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
