Not admitted at AJA events – excepted European Championships FEI – are athletes who were AJA members but were excluded by the General Assembly for any reasons.

At Qualifying and Final Competitions of the Challenge Cup, only AJA members can participate who are registered for this Cup.

At Qualifying and Final Competitions of the Europa and Challenge Cups, only AJA members receive points who are registered for the Cups and who have paid their AJA membership for the current year.



Special rules for the European Championships V:

If an athlete of the European Championships is eliminated or withdraws after the first scoring competition (Table C – Art. V14), he is allowed to start at the CSIV-B classes during the 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 4^{th} day.

If an athlete is eliminated or withdraws after the 1^{st} round of the 2^{nd} scoring competition (Nations Team Competition), he is allowed to start at the CSIV-B classes on the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} day.

If an athlete is eliminated or withdraws after the 2nd round of the 2nd scoring competition (Nations Team Competition), he is allowed to start at the CSIV-B classes on the 3rd and 4th day, but cannot start on the 3rd day at the Grand Prix AJA (two rounds!).

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
