Conditions are that these riders fulfil the age requirements and that during the current year they do not jump in classes whose initial course is higher than 1,30m.

Not admitted at AJA events – excepted European Championships – are riders who were AJA members but were excluded by the General Assembly for any reasons.

At Qualifying and Final competitions of the Challenge Cup, only AJA members can participate who are registered for this Cup.

CHECKLIST FOR DRAFT SCHEDULE JUMPING 2010

At Qualifying and Final competitions of the Europa and Challenge Cups, only AJA members receive points who are registered for the Cups and who have paid their AJA membership for the current year.

At the Finals of the Europa Cup, the Challenge Cup and the Top Ten of the "Best of Ambassadors" ranking, only AJA members can participate and who have qualified , according to AJA rules.

Horses which are engaged for the Europa Cup Final are allowed to participate on the 1^{st} day at a "Warm up" competition, the 2^{nd} day at the 1^{st} competition counting for the Final and the 4^{th} day the Final (2 rounds). The 3^{rd} day is a rest day for these horses.

If a qualified rider of the Europa Cup Final is eliminated or withdraws after the first round of the first Final competition (Nations Team Competition), he is allowed to start at the other CSIV-B classes during the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} day. If a rider is eliminated or withdraws after the 2^{nd} round, he is allowed to start on the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} day, but cannot start on the 3^{rd} day at the Grand Prix (2 rounds)

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
