Invited are all European Nations. Max. 5 competitors per nation, Nations without teams max. 2 competitors admitted for the European Championship. For all other competitions further riders will be permitted who will be invited by the Organizing Committee through their respective NF. These riders will not be allowed to take part in the championships classes. Max. 3 horses per competitor.

Female riders age group 1961 and older

Male riders age group 1957 and older

**RIDERS**, who have not taken part in any jumping competition higher than 1.30m in 2006.

##### **Veterinarians**

Invited are all European Nations. Max. 5 competitors per nation, Nations without teams max. 2 competitors admitted for the European Championship. For all other competitions further riders will be permitted who will be invited by the Organizing Committee through their respective NF. Max. 3 horses per competitor.

The competitors have to be qualified veterinarians.

##### **Masterlist**

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors ("masterlist"), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

### **VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS AND PASSPORT CONTROLS**

These will be carried out in accordance with Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011 and the Rules for Jumping Events, Annex VII. General Regulations 21<sup>st</sup> edition 2005 will apply:

#### **In accordance with Art.139.1**

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs, CSIs1/2\*, CSIJYPVCh Cat. B in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for CSIs3/4/5\*, CSIJYPVCh Cat. A, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2) , must have an official valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

#### **In accordance with Art. 139.2**

Horses taking part in CNs, CSIs1/2\*, CSIJYPVCh Cat. B in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable, and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

### EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION (Vet. Regs. Annex VII)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given no less than 1 month and no more than 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 (seven) days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

### SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES, Vet. Regs. Chap V & VI and Annex IV

Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs3/4/5\*, CDIs3\*, CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

### MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUPS I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of **CHF 12.50** per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

### APPROVED LABORATORY - APPLICABLE ONLY TO GROUPS I and II

Under the Medical Control Programme (MCP) in Groups I and II, all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by Laboratoire Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, 91370 Verrières le Buisson, France, Tel.: +33.1 - 69 75 28 28, Fax: +33.1 - 69 75 28 29.

### HEALTH CERTIFICATES

At the time of the first horse examination, i.e. on arrival of the horses on the show venue and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event:

- a) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex B of the directive 90/426 EEC in the currently valid issue (see attached specimen)
- b) if the competitor comes from a third country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the currently valid issue.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organizer sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents. Besides, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

## **IX. Miscellaneous**

All competitors entering a horse for this event, accept for themselves, their grooms and their horses the conditions laid down in the schedule and programme.

### **1. Protests**

All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150,- or equivalent in order to be valid.

### **2. Prizes**

In each competition at least 25% of the competitors will receive prizes. There will be no prize money but prizes of honour, ribbons and plaques.

### **3. Insurances**

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

### **4. Liability**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

### **5. Event's Organization**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury, the starters and the delegate of the German NF the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI-Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

### **6. Entry Rights**

Entry right to the stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

Competitors, one accompanying person and one groom per competitor, Chef d'Equipe, veterinarian, horse owners (2 per horse), judges and a limited number of members of the organizing committee will get free admission cards.

### **Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area!!!**

### **7. Declaration of Starters**

The Chefs d'Equipe will designate in writing the members of their team (three or four) or their individual competitors and the names of their horses (a single and same horse for each competition for the three competitions of the Championship) as starters on Wednesday, 14<sup>th</sup> June, 2006 by 8 p. m. for the European Championships VJR and on Thursday, 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2006 by 1.00 p. m. Participants in the VJR competitions have to enrol themselves into a starting list in the show office 120 minutes before the beginning of the respective competition at the latest. Declaration for the first competition on Thursday can be made on Wednesday day from 5 to 7 p.m. in the show office.

### **8. Doctor/Veterinarian/Farrier**

The expenses have to be paid by the participants themselves.

### **Code of Conduct**

The Federation Equestre International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Conversion of times into points for individual and team rating:

The scores obtained by each competitor will be converted into points by multiplying the time of each competitor by the coefficient 0.50 and rounded down from .004.

The competitor with the lowest number of points after this conversion will be given zero penalties, the other competitors being credited with the number of penalties representing the difference in points between each of them and the leading competitor. If a competitor is eliminated or does not complete his round for any reason, he will be awarded the same number of penalties as that incurred by the competitor who has been the most severely penalised, plus 20 penalties. If the competitor concerned has himself received the highest number of penalties before being eliminated or retiring, 20 penalties will be added to his score. Adding the 20 penalties is done after the time difference has been converted into penalties.

The second round is open only to the ten best teams in the first round and those teams with equality of penalties for tenth place.

Before the ten best placed teams and those teams with equality of penalties for the tenth place begin their second round, all individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round may take part in a second round qualifier for the third competition.

Starting order in the 1<sup>st</sup> round: acc. to RG jumping Art. 325.4 and 252.

The starting order of the ten best placed teams and those with equality of penalties for tenth place in the second round is according to the reverse order of total penalties of the best three competitors per team incurred in the first competition and of the best three competitors per team in the first round of the team competition. Teams with equality of total penalties retain the same starting order as in the first round.

The starting order for individuals and team competitors taking part in a second round qualifier for the Final competition is according to the reverse order total penalties incurred in the first competition and the first round of the team competition. In case of competitors with equality of penalties, the score of the first competition will decide their starting order.

Team Rating:

The ten teams and those with equality of penalties for tenth place receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the best three competitors in each

team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team of the two rounds of the second competition. The team, which has obtained the least number of penalties will be placed first and declared Continental Team Champion.

In the event of equality of penalties between teams for first, second and/or third place, there will be a jump-off against the clock in which all team competitors may take part, over at least six obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread at a speed of 350 m per minute.

The score in this jump-off is obtained by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team, but in the event of further equality of penalties, the times of these three competitors in the jump-off added together will decide the winning team as well as those placed second or third. The score of this jump-off is only to determine the placing of the teams and will not count towards the final scores of the individual competitors.

If two jump-offs are required, the jump-off for the third place shall precede the jump-off for the first and the second place.

If after the jump-off there is equality of penalties and time for one of the first three places, the teams concerned will be placed equal.

Teams not qualified for the second round of the Team competition receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in the first round of the team competition.

have completed the second competition (without having been eliminated or having  
retired) or have taken part in the first competition (completed or not) and have com-  
pleted the first round of the second competition as well as the round replacing the  
second round of the team competition for individuals and members of teams not  
qualified for the second round of the team competition (without having been elimi-  
nated or having retired). If for any reason one or more of these 25 best placed  
competitors are unable to start, they will be replaced by participants from the reserve list  
of five competitors.

The starting order for Round A will follow the reverse order of penalties incurred  
in the first and second competitions. For those individuals and members of teams  
not qualified for the second round of the team competition the starting order will  
follow the reverse order of penalties incurred in the first competition and the first  
round of the second competition as well as the round replacing the second round  
of the team competition. In the event of equality of penalties, the score of the first  
competition will decide the starting order. The 25<sup>th</sup> qualified will, therefore, start  
as number one.

The starting order for Round B will follow the reverse order of total penalties in-  
curred in round A of the Final competition, as well as in the first and second com-  
petitions. For those individuals and members of teams not qualified for the sec-  
ond round of the team competition the starting order will follow the reverse order  
of total penalties incurred in Round A of the Final competition, the first competi-  
tion and the first round of the second competition, as well as the round replacing  
the second round of the team competition. The competitor with the most penalties

Rating for the European Individual Championship:

The individual placing is determined by adding together for each competitor the  
penalties incurred in the first competition, as well as the two Rounds of the sec-  
ond competition (disregarding the penalties incurred in the jump-off if there is

one) and the two Rounds A and B of the third competition. For those individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition their score in the second round qualifier counts instead of the second round of the team competition.

The competitor with the least penalties will be placed first and declared the Continental Champion.

In the event of equality for one of the first three places after Round B of the third competition, there will be a jump-off against the clock at a speed of 350 m per minute over 8 obstacles from the courses of Rounds A and B.

The competitors will be invited to inspect the jump-off course.

If two jump-offs are required, the jump-off for the third place shall precede the jump-off for the first place and the second place.

If after the jump-off there is equality of penalties and time for one of the first three places, competitors concerned will be placed equal.

The second round is open only to the ten best teams in the first round and those teams with equality of penalties for tenth place.

Before the ten best placed teams and those teams with equality of penalties for the tenth place begin their second round, all individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round may take part in a second round qualifier for the third competition.

Starting order in the 1<sup>st</sup> round: acc. to RG jumping Art. 325.4 and 252.

The starting order of the ten best placed teams and those with equality of penalties for tenth place in the second round is according to the reverse order of total penalties of the best three competitors per team incurred in the first competition and of the best three competitors per team in the first round of the team competition. Teams with equality of total penalties retain the same starting order as in the first round.

The starting order for individuals and team competitors taking part in a second round qualifier for the Final competition is according to the reverse order total penalties incurred in the first competition and the first round of the team competition. In case of competitors with equality of penalties, the score of the first competition will decide their starting order.

#### Team Rating:

The ten teams and those with equality of penalties for tenth place receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the best three competitors in each team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team of the two rounds of the second competition. The team, which has obtained the least number of penalties will be placed first and declared Continental Team Champion.

In the event of equality of penalties between teams for first, second and/or third place, there will be a jump-off against the clock in which all team competitors may take part, over at least six obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread at a speed of 350 m per minute.

The score in this jump-off is obtained by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team, but in the event of further equality of penalties, the times of these three competitors in the jump-off added together will decide the winning team as well as those placed second or third. The score of this jump-off is only to determine the placing of the teams and will not count towards the final scores of the individual competitors.

If two jump-offs are required, the jump-off for the third place shall precede the jump-off for the first and the second place.

If after the jump-off there is equality of penalties and time for one of the first three places, the teams concerned will be placed equal.

Teams not qualified for the second round of the Team competition receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in the first round of the team competition.

This third competition is compulsory for the 15 best-placed competitors and horses (including those with equality of penalties for 15<sup>th</sup> place) according to the cumulative penalties over the first and second competitions or according to the cumulative penalties over the first competition and first round of the second competition as well as the round replacing the second round of the team competition for individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition. Competitors must have taken part in the first competition (completed or not) and have completed the second competition (without having been eliminated or having retired) or have taken part in the first competition (completed or not) and have completed the first round of the second competition as well as the round replacing the second round of the team competition for individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition (without having been eliminated or having retired). If for any reason one or more of these 15 best placed competitors are unable to start, they will be replaced by participants from the reserve list of five competitors.  
The starting order for Round A will follow the reverse order of penalties incurred in the first and second competitions. For those individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition the starting order will follow the reverse order of penalties incurred in the first competition and the first round of the second competition as well as the round replacing the second round of the team competition. In the event of equality of penalties, the score of the first competition will decide the starting order. The 15<sup>th</sup> qualified will, therefore, start as number one.  
The starting order for Round B will follow the reverse order of total penalties incurred in round A of the Final competition, as well as in the first and second competitions. For those individuals and members of teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition the starting order will follow the reverse order of total penalties incurred in Round A of the Final competition, the first competition and the first round of the second competition, as well as the round replacing the second round of the team competition. The competitor with the most penalties will start first, the competitor with the least penalties will start last. In the event of competitors with equality of penalties, the score of the first competition will decide their starting order.
